This season will have its own storylines. Can Howard become the first coach in state history to top 1,000 career coaching wins? Will Pope make it three consecutive state titles? If so, the Greyhounds would be the first program to do that since Columbus High did from 2010-12. And in the Class 1A Public division, will Gordon Lee win another title and join Charlton County and Schley County as the only programs to win two titles each since the division was created in 2013?

It's fun to speculate and hopefully this magazine will help you do just that. I thank my family (Stacy and Olivia) for their help in this task and ultimately, I thank my wonderful Lord & Saviour Jesus Christ for guidance and wisdom. With him all things are possible. Thanks for taking time to read this publication. We hope it's the most comprehensive guide to high school baseball in Georgia you can find.



AMERICUS (1961-1970) -

Americus had already established itself as a state baseball power by winning three consecutive Class A state titles from 1953-1955. But after missing the playoffs for five straight seasons, the Panthers reestablished themselves on the diamond starting in 1961.

Under the direction of Georgia Dugout Club Hall of Fame coach Melvin Kinslow, Americus won state titles in 1961, 1964, 1965, 1966 and 1969 before Kinslow stepped aside. The Panthers won another state championship in 1970 under coach Loveard McMichael.

From 1961-1970, Americus High won six state titles and finished as the state runner-up twice (1962 and 1963). The school made the playoffs every year, a remarkable accomplishment considering only four teams from each classification made the state playoffs back then.

CARTERSVILLE (2001-2010) -

There wasn't a program that dominated the early part of the 2000s like Cartersville. From 2001-2003, the Purple Hurricanes won three consecutive state titles and during that run, Cartersville never lost a postseason game. The program added back-to-back titles in 2008-09.

From 2001-2010, the Hurricanes won five state titles, finished as the state runner-up to LaGrange in 2004 and lost in the state quarterfinals three times. When Blessed Trinity eliminated the Hurricanes in the

second round in 2007, it was the only time during the run that Cartersville's season ended before the quarterfinal round.

The Hurricanes won eight region titles and won 286 games during their dominant run. Cartersville had a 57-game winning streak in region play from 2006-08.

CLINCH COUNTY (1985-1992)

Clinch County dominated Class A under longtime coach Cecil Barber. When Barber restarted the baseball program from the ground up in 1983, it took him a few years to get things going. He guided the Panthers to the state semifinals in 1985 where they lost to eventual state champion Calhoun County. But over the next seven seasons, Clinch County was on top of the Class A baseball world. The Panthers won back-to-back state titles in 1986 and '87. Then after losing in the first round in 1988, Clinch County won three more state titles in the next four seasons (1989, 1991, 1992). Sandwiched in the run was a state runner-up finish in 1990 when the Panthers lost to Bremen in the championship series.

The Panthers' run ended in 1993 when they failed to make the state playoffs. Barber would lead Clinch County to one more state championship in 2003 before stepping aside after winning more than 400 games in 25 seasons.

Clinch County's 1989 team was a special one as it helped the school complete the Triple Crown. The Panthers' athletic program won state titles in football, boys basketball and baseball in the same academic year, becoming the only program in Georgia High School Association history to complete the mark.

COLUMBUS (1991-1996)

Since 1984, the Columbus High School baseball program has captured 12 state baseball championships, one shy of Marist who holds the state record for most titles. But there was no greater time of baseball prosperity than from 1991-1996 when the Blue Devils won five state titles in six seasons. The lone exception was in 1993 when Lakeside-Evans swept the Blue Devils in the state semifinals.

From 1994-96 when the program won three straight titles, Columbus High did it in dominating fashion, sweeping 11 of its 12 postseason series. The GHSA state playoffs consisted of just four playoff rounds before it was later expanded to five rounds and 32 teams per classification during the 1997 season. After the team's championship in 1996, Hall of Fame coach Bobby Howard took a one-year hiatus from high school baseball and coached at Middle Georgia College in Cochran before returning to Columbus High in the same capacity in 1998.

COLUMBUS (2003-2012) -

The Blue Devils won five state titles in a 10-year span from 2003-2012, but it could have been so many more. In addition to its five state titles, Columbus High played in the state championship series nine of the 10 seasons during that span. The Blue Devils finished as state runner-ups in 2003, 2006, 2007 and 2009. The only time the program didn't play in the state championship series was when eventual state champion Cartersville ousted Columbus in three games in the guarterfinals in 2008.

From 2010-2012, Columbus High rolled to three consecutive state championships, the second time it won three consecutive state titles in its history. The Blue Devils were led by 2006 Little League World Series champion heroes Kyle Carter and JT Phillips in those three championships.

EVANS (1988-1996)

Hall of Fame coach Terry Holder developed the pin-stripe Knights into a high school version of the New York Yankees. Evans was one of the most-feared programs and dominated Georgia's highest

classification. The Knights won three consecutive state titles from 1988-1990, destroying just about every team in their path. They swept Statesboro, Tift County and Newnan to claim the state title in 1988. Then in 1989, the Knights swept Newnan, Columbus and Stone Mountain to win another title.

Sandwiched in the three straight state titles, Evans had a state record 61-game winning streak that was broken by cross-county rival Harlem in the spring of 1990. However, that mark still stands as a state record today. After not making the state playoffs in 1991 and 1992, Evans returned to the top of the prep baseball world in Georgia with back-to-back titles in 1993 and 1994.

In 1995 and 1996, the Knights finished as the state runner-up.

GAINESVILLE (1994-2002) -

When Gainesville High lost in the state semifinals in back-to-back seasons (1994 and 1995), it was the start of a major dynasty in Northeast Georgia. The Red Elephants won three consecutive state titles from 1996-98, and the '97 and '98 squads didn't lose a game in the postseason. Gainesville was swept by Harlem in the 1999 state semifinals and in 2000, they were swept by Westminster in the first round. The 2000 season was the only time in the Elephants' nine-year run of dominance that they suffered a first-round loss.

But the team returned with a vengeance in 2001. Putting together perhaps the best two seasons of baseball in school history, the Red Elephants steam rolled the competition and captured back-to-back state titles in 2001 and 2002. Neither team lost a playoff series. Future Major Leaguer Micah Owings and John Carroll helped the 2001 team finish 34-1 and they outscored Eastside, Pepperell, Screven County, Westminster and Swainsboro by a combined 111-16 in the playoffs. The Elephants, in 2002, did it again with much of the same team. They demolished Riverwood, Madison County, Westside-Augusta, Westminster and Loganville by a combined 105-16 in the playoffs and finished the season with a 33-3 record.

GREENBRIER (1997-2007)

The school opened its doors in the fall of 1996 and in its first year of existence, the Wolfpack made state history when it became the first team to win a state baseball championship in its first year of existence. Greenbrier finished with a 34-3 record and defeated nationally-ranked Hardaway in three games to win the Class 3A state championship. Class 3A was then the state's second largest classification. The Wolfpack proceeded to win two more consecutive state championships when they swept Madison County in 1998, then Greenbrier won its third straight crown in 1999 by besting Marist in three games. The school's first three titles were won under legendary coach Terry Holder, a member of the Georgia Dugout Club Hall of Fame.

Holder retired after the 1999 campaign and Greenbrier continued its winning ways. The top-ranked Wolfpack were stunned in the second round of the Class 3A state playoffs by Lee County in 2000, but the Wolfpack made back-to-back trips to the state semifinals in 2001 and 2002 as well as in 2004. The only year the Wolfpack didn't make the state playoffs in their first 10 seasons was in 2005. However, under Holder's son Rodney, the Wolfpack rebounded and won back-to-back titles in 2006 and 2007.

HARLEM (1974-1983)

Playing in baseball-rich Columbia County, Harlem's baseball program became as famous around the state as the Hollywood comedy duo of Laurel & Hardy. Tommy Price guided the Bulldogs to their first state title in 1974 when Harlem swept Irwin County and finished with a 21-1 record. Price led Harlem to a state runner-up finish in 1975, then the state semifinals in 1977 and a second state championship in 1978. Price stepped down to become the school's principal after the season, opening the door for a young coach named Jimmie Lewis to take over.

Lewis guided Harlem to a state championship in his first season in 1979. The Bulldogs swept East Rome and finished the year with a 20-7 record, ending the season on a 14-game winning streak. Then after missing the playoffs in 1980, Harlem rebounded to win three consecutive state titles from 1981-83. The Bulldogs swept Cedar Grove in back-to-back years to win titles in 1981-82, then they bested Briarcliff in three games in 1983. In Harlem's back-to-back-to-back title runs, they went a combined 73-20-1. Harlem did add another state title to its resume in 1986.

THE LOVETT SCHOOL (1990-1999)

Lovett's dynasty in the 1990s established a winning culture at the school many years before the school's present run. In fact, it may have helped trigger it. The Lions won state titles in 1990, 1993, 1994 and 1999. Lovett could have had a few more had it not been for Gainesville, who had its own dynasty. Gainesville topped the Lions in 1996 and 1997 in the state championship series.

THE LOVETT SCHOOL (2006-present)

Quietly, the metro Atlanta private school has churned out five state titles (2006, 2009, 2013, 2016, 2018), a state runner-up finish (2008) and made three trips each to the semifinals and quarterfinals. In the Lions' 13 years of domination, they have made the state playoffs every season and with the exception of 2007, Lovett has advanced to the quarterfinal round or beyond. The 2007 squad lost in the first round to eventual state runner-up Calhoun.

Since 2006, Lovett boasts a combined record of 317-141-1. The Lions have won state championships when they didn't win their region. And just once during the program's run have they won 30 games. The 2006 squad finished 30-7, while the 2013 championship team won 29 games.

MARIST (1977-1985)

Under legendary coach Jerry Queen, the War Eagles were one of the state's top programs, winning championships in 1977, 1981, 1983, 1984 and 1985. They also finished as the state runner-up in 1978 to Gainesville, and they lost in the state semifinals to Coffee in 1980. After winning the state title in 1981 by taking two of three from Ringgold, the War Eagles missed the playoffs in 1982, the only time they missed the postseason from 1977-1985.

However, Marist returned with three consecutive state titles from 1983-85. In 1985, the War Eagles compiled perhaps their most dominant team. They easily swept Winder-Barrow, Carrollton and Troup. It was the last title for the school until 1990. The War Eagles did finish as the state runner-up in 1988.

MARIST (2000-2013) -

Marist maintained its claim as one of the top baseball programs in the history of the Georgia High School Association by winning state titles in 2002, 2003, 2010 and 2011. They also finished as the state runner-up in 2000, 2006 and 2013. Marist also made two trips to the semifinals and four trips to the quarterfinals. The War Eagles made the postseason every year from 2000-2013 and they never lost before the second round.

Only twice was Marist beaten in the second round – in 2008 when they were swept by Sequoyah and in 2013 when the War Eagles were stunned by Alexander in three games.

Even though it was outside their dominant run, Marist added a state title in 2017 to give the school 13 state titles, the most in the GHSA history.

MOUNT DE SALES (1966-1980)

The once all-girls school (until 1959) didn't field a varsity baseball team until 1964. Two years later, the Cavaliers captured the first of eight state baseball titles over a 15-year span. Mount de Sales won state championships in 1966, 1968, 1969, 1971, 1972, 1976, 1978 and 1980. The program also had state runner-up finishes in 1967, 1977 and 1979. Just two times between 1966-1980 did the Cavaliers not make the postseason.

Five coaches – Donnie Veal, Sam Humphries, Charles Stewart, Billy Henderson and Chester Pierce – directed the Cavalier program during their dynasty. Pierce, who took over in 1973 and coached for 29 seasons, had perhaps the school's greatest run from 1976-1980 when he had Mount de Sales in the state championship series each season.

PARKVIEW (2010-present) -

The Panthers were known as a baseball power under Hall of Fame coach Hugh Buchanan, who guided the program to three state titles in a seven-year span from 1996-2002. However, Parkview has taken its dominance to a new level this decade. The Panthers have claimed state titles in 2011, 2012, 2015 and 2018. The 2015 squad was declared national champions by five major media outlets. The 2012 and 2018 teams were voted national champions by Baseball America.

In Parkview's present run, the Panthers have four state titles, two trips to the semifinals and one trip to the quarterfinals while playing in Georgia's highest classification. The program has an impressive

258-61 combined record since 2010 and notched eight region titles. Parkview has won 30 or more games four times in its current run, including a school-record 35 victories in 2018. The Panthers have never dropped more than 10 games in a season.

The 2015 squad may have been the program's most-dominant. They lost just two games and finished the season on a 26-game winning streak. They swept Mill Creek, Lowndes, Etowah, Pope and Walton to win the championship. Meanwhile, the 2018 squad needed three games to oust Woodstock in the semifinals before sweeping county rival Mill Creek in the championship series.

PEPPERELL (1952-1960)

Had it not been for larger programs such as Richmond Academy and Americus in 1950s, Pepperell would be the program everyone remembered for its dominance in Georgia prep baseball. The mill town of Lindale produced some of the state's best high school teams from 1952-1960. The Dragons won three straight GHSA Class B championships from 1952-1954. Then after a rebuilding season in 1955 in which Pepperell missed the state playoffs, they rebounded with a state runner-up finish in 1956, followed by back-to-back state championships in 1957 and 1958.

Pepperell ended the decade by finishing as the state runner-up in 1960.

POPE (2009-present)

The Greyhounds captured the school's first state baseball title in 2009 when they swept South Forsyth in Class 5A, then the largest classification in the state. Little did anybody know that it would be the beginning of a dynasty for the Cobb County power. Pope made the playoffs every year from 2009-18 and captured another state title in 2013 when they swept Greenbrier in Class 5A in 2013. Then as a member of Class 6A, the Greyhounds went back-to-back in 2017 and 2018. In 2017, they swept Lee County and finished fifth nationally by Perfect Game. In 2018, labeled by many as a rebuilding year, the Greyhounds had a 22-game winning streak before they lost to Cambridge in their final game of the regular season. They then finished 10-3 in the postseason, defeating Allatoona in three games in the state finals.

Pope went to the quarterfinals twice, the semifinals once (2015) and finished as the state runner-up in 2016 to neighborhood rival Walton in the state's highest classification. During the Greyhounds' 10-year run of dominance, they boasted an overall record of 260-90, including a combined 96-22 record from 2016-18.

RICHMOND ACADEMY (1949-1958)

Perhaps a record that will never be broken, Richmond Academy won seven straight championships and was one of the most-feared baseball teams in the Southeast under legendary coach AL Williams. After taking over the baseball program in March of 1949, the Musketeers established themselves as the state's top program. From 1951-1957, Williams and Richmond Academy compiled a record of 147-13 and the program won seven straight titles. During that span, Richmond won a trio of Southern Regional Baseball Tournaments (which featured state champions from the Southeast).

TATTNALL SQUARE (2000-present)

No team dominated the Georgia Independent Schools Association like Tattnall Square. The Trojans won eight state titles (2000, 2001, 2005, 2008, 2009, 2012, 2013, 2014), finished as the state runner-up once (2010) and had its season end in the state semifinals six times. Since Joey Hiller took over the program in 1999, only two of his teams had their season end before the semifinal round.

Tattnall moved to the GHSA after the 2014 season. In four seasons in the Class 1A Private classification, the Trojans have two state titles (2016, 2018), a state runner-up finish (2017) and a trip to the state semifinals (2015). Between the two organizations (GISA, GHSA), Tattnall Square teams have combined to win more than 500 games.

In 2018, MaxPreps ranked Tattnall 25th nationally in its Top 25 high school baseball dynasties since 2009, the only school ranked from Georgia.

WESLEYAN (2007-2016)

Two coaches – Mike Shaheen and Brian Krehmeyer – helped turned the Norcross private school into a state power. In 10 seasons, the Wolves lost before the quarterfinals just twice – in 2011 they lost to Darlington in the second round, then they lost to Mount Paran Christian in the first round in 2012.

After making the semifinals in 2007, Wesleyan won three straight from 2008-2010 while boasting such players as Grayson Garvin, James Ramsey, Connor Winn, Conor Welton, Devin Stanton and Kevin O'Leary. Krehmeyer took over in 2011. The Wolves made the quarterfinals in 2013, the semifinals in 2014 and captured the state crown in 2015, sweeping their opponents in all five rounds of the postseason.

The Wolves finished as the state runner-up in 2016.



Putting It All Together

Parkview wins program's seventh state title

Chan Brown said it's unfair to compare championship teams. While the Parkview baseball coach won't rate his 2018 squad to others that captured titles, one might get the feeling last season's club may be one of his most-satisfying.

After a season of adversity, the Panthers rolled to the program's seventh baseball title, capturing the Georgia High School Association Class 7A championship. It was the program's second in four seasons and third in seven years.

The preseason No. 1 had the talent, but Brown said the road to get to the championship wasn't an easy one.

"This year tested them and the coaches a little bit," Brown told The Gwinnett Daily Post after sweeping Mill Creek in the state championship series.

"We had a lot of pressure on us being No. 2 in the nation, and we didn't handle it very well. Through trying times this group formed some chemistry and love and a bond that, honestly, by the end was really hard to beat."

But the early part of the season was rough.

Parkview (35-6) started the season with a loss to Gwinnett County rival North Gwinnett in its opener, then lost to Mill Creek a week later to start the season 3-2. The Panthers didn't exactly play badly, but it wasn't up to par with how Brown wanted things.

The coach sensed there was some friction between the coaches and the players, and he said some players were feeling the pressure from scouts concerning the upcoming baseball draft. He had a meeting to clear things up.

"It just wasn't fun anymore," said standout Logan Cerny. "After that meeting, we had fun the second half of the season."

After a loss to Blessed Trinity in the Perfect Game Showdown, the Panthers lost just two more regular-season games. But Brown said a spring break trip to Florida where Parkview defeated national powers Venice, Sarasota and Tampa Jesuit helped the team grow and mature.

"We went through a lot of adversity, which kind of built our chemistry and camaraderie," Brown said. "There is a lot of love in our program and after that trip, we were all on the same page."

After defeating arch-rival Brookwood to close the season and capture the Region 7-7A title, the Panthers rolled into the semifinals after sweeping Rockdale County, Mountain View and Etowah. They earned a rematch with Woodstock in the semifinals after Woodstock eliminated the Panthers from the postseason in 2017.

After falling by a run in the first game, the Panthers won the next two, then swept Mill Creek in the championship series.

Denying any sort of superstition, Parkview won every playoff series while wearing its all-orange uniforms.

"We kind of adopted the motto, 'Unfinished Business,' from last year," infielder Allan del Castillo said. "When we put those orange uniforms on, we felt like nobody could beat us. It was time to go."

Parkview won another title on the strength of a lethal pitching rotation led by left-handed starters Robert Bennett and Braden Hays, who both went 12-1 on the mound. Miles Garrett was the team's third starter, while middle relievers Jarrett Embry and Brad Stanley were strong. Cerny established himself as the team's closer.

On offense, Cerny, Michael Bryant, Bennett, Jonathan French, Isaiah Byars and Ben Markiewicz led a talented offense. Cerny hit seven homers in the postseason alone,

including a two-run shot in the eighth inning that helped Parkview to a 3-1 victory in Game 1 of the championship series. The defense made just one error in the postseason.

After not handling the pressure of high national rankings by various media outlets during the season, the Panthers were named the eventual national champions by Baseball America.

Which gave Brown a reason to smile.

PARKVIEW

Parkview won't trot out two shutdown pitchers this spring like they did last year when Braden Hays and Robert Bennett helped propel the Panthers to the Class 7A title. But the Panthers do have enough leftover talent to make another deep playoff run. And a wealth of younger players are hungry to keep Parkview's baseball tradition alive.

The pitching staff won't be as deep but as the staff matures, it could be just as lethal. Senior right-hander Miles Garrett, the team's No. 3 starter last year, returns as well as ace reliever Brad Stanley.

In addition, right-hander Xander Stephens and Blake Sagarese will receive plenty of innings. The Bulldogs return all-state performers Michael Borah and Josh Shuler as well as a host others. The biggest concern for North Gwinnett is a young and unproven pitching staff. If the offense can perform well and give their young pitchers time to mature, the Bulldogs will be tough to beat come postseason time.



WAITON

The Raiders underachieved last season in a year in which they were loaded with talent, and they lost in the first round of the state playoffs. Look for Walton to bounce back this spring, especially with an offense that is capable of putting up big numbers. Luke Boynton, Pierce Gallo and John Giesler each had big seasons in 2018, and the trio returns. The biggest strength appears to be a lethal pitching rotation led by senior Jacob Baldino.





SOUTH FORSYTH

To put it mildly, this is the year South Forsyth has been building for many years. And the War Eagles do have the talent to make a deep postseason run. While it starts with All-American pitcher Landon Sims on the mound, South Forsyth has enough proven arms (Tyler Cowan, Steven Thompson, Peyton Presley and Peyton Rawlins) to shut down the opposition. If the War Eagles can muster the offense, this team can go as far as it wants.



NORTH PAULDING

There may not be a team with more talent in Class 7A than North Paulding. The Wolfpack have three Division I-caliber arms in right-handers Chandler Wood, Zach Maxwell and Mikade Johnson. And they have the offense returning as well with Cole Dunn and Mickey Maguire.



MOUNTAIN VIEW

The Bears won't be sneaking up on anybody this spring. Mountain View is loaded and could have their best team since 2015 when they made the state quarterfinals. Most of the optimism is because of a strong senior class led by pitchers Gavin Collyer and Cole Johnston. With as many as eight starters back, the Bears will be dangerous.







Carrying the Torch

Pope continues recent baseball dominance with 6A title

Max Pralgo didn't enter the 2018 season with a chip on his shoulder, but he did feel like his Pope High School baseball team was a little disrespected after the Greyhounds won the Georgia High School Association Class 6A state title in 2017.

Pope didn't have shutdown pitchers Ryan Webb and Chase Smith, two key ingredients the Greyhounds rode to the title the year before, but Pralgo believed the 2018 edition had enough talent to chase another championship.

And he was right.

Pope went back-to-back, defeating Allatoona in three games for its second straight title and fourth in 10 seasons.

"We felt like some people doubted us," Pralgo said. "That made us want to work hard and win it with the team we had."

It took a few games for the Greyhounds (34-8) to figure things out. Pope started the season 3-3 but found its identity and won 29 of 33 to make it back to the state championship round for the third consecutive season. The Greyhounds finished as the state runner-up in 2016 in the state's highest classification.

They have compiled an impressive 96-22 record during the past three seasons, but coach Jeff Rowland doesn't want any talk about his program becoming a dynasty.

"Going into the season, we weren't sure what we were going to have," Rowland said. "Every year is different, and every team has its own dynamics. It took a little while for this team to figure things out, but they put all the pieces of the puzzle together. It was awesome. I can't say enough good things about them."

Pralgo led a strong pitching rotation that consisted of Scotty Lesieur and Reid Robertson. But the bullpen of Andrew Herlitz, Harris East and Nate Shipley was especially strong, giving the Greyhounds a chance to win in every game.

On offense, shortstop Buddy Floyd, Caden Smith, Pralgo and Antonio Jareno anchored an offense that put up solid numbers.

"We had a lot of new guys who were playing at the varsity level for the first time," Floyd said. "It started out slowly, but after those first few games, everything fell into place after that."

Pope won 22 in a row before Cambridge halted the Greyhounds' momentum with a one-run victory in the final game of the regular season.

But Pope swept Dacula in the first round of the state playoffs, then needed three games each to defeat Harrison and Houston County in the next two rounds.

The Greyhounds played perhaps their best round of the postseason in

the semifinals when they swept a pair of games from nationally-ranked River Ridge to advance to the finals. River Ridge was the preseason No. 1 in Class 6A.

Pope then ousted Allatoona in three games to win the state title.

Rowland said he did talk to his team about keeping Pope's recent dominance going.

"We talked about passing the torch," he said. "We lost several one-run games early that we had a chance to win. These guys figured out how to win those games, and they took it upon themselves to keep carrying the torch. They got better every day."



Playing for each other

Loganville goes back-to-back, wins fourth title in 11 seasons

When a reporter asked Loganville coach Jeff Segars to compare the 2018 version to past state baseball champions at the school, he hesitated at first, then went on with his response.

"They were right up there (with some of the best)," Segars said, almost as if he hoped nobody heard him. "With the pressure that was put on them, they handled it well."

The defending Class 5A champions went back-to-back and captured their fourth state title in the past 11 seasons. The Red Devils (34-6) ended the season on a 21-game winning streak and didn't lose a game in April or May.

While the pitching rotation which consisted of Joseph Brandon, Bay Witcher and Seth Clark as well as Connor Bruce and Bryant Pietri drew most of the headlines, the Red Devils mixed in enough offense to set a school record for most wins in a season.

Clark said he knew Loganville was going to get everyone's best shot, but it was important for the team to stay focused and feed off its unshakeable chemistry.

"We said this a lot, 'We had a good day today, but come back and have a better one tomorrow," he said. "Nobody was selfish on this team. We always played together no matter what."

The team bonded well during offseason workouts. While they knew they had a chance to make another deep run in 2018, they stayed focused and kept working. Pietri said coaches constantly told the team they could not dwell on being the defending state champions.

"They often told us that nobody was going to care that we won the state championship last year (in 2017)," he said. "It was a new year and we had to work hard if we hoped to do it again."

The Red Devils were tested early in the season. They lost their fourth game of the season – a 6-0 setback to eventual Class 7A state runner-up Mill Creek, then dropped two more games to Blessed Trinity and Lambert in the prestigious

Georgia Peach Invitational. They lost just three more times in a brutal nonregion slate before rolling into April with a 14-7 record. The Red Devils won their remaining 11 regular-season games, then swept East Paulding, North Springs, Locust Grove and Starr's Mill before meeting region rival Buford for the Class 5A state championship series.

Loganville had beaten Buford 4-2 and 8-1 in their two previous regularseason meetings, but Segars said he knew his team would likely see the Wolves again.


"The games against them were a lot closer than the scores showed," he said. "They got better, but we also worked hard to get better."

Loganville won the first game of the series 13-3, then edged the Wolves 3-2 for the sweep. Clark said Loganville's chemistry was special.

"We loved playing for each other," he said. "And we all had each other's back."

The fourth state title in 11 seasons put the Loganville program in elite company. But Segars refused to speculate which of his four state championship teams was the best.

That discussion, if ever, will be another topic for another day.

BUFORD

There won't be many teams in the state that will have a better 1-2 pitching punch this season than Buford. Right-hander Ramsey David and left-hander Sean Adams were a key reason for the Wolves' run to the Class 5A state championship series last year. The duo combined to win 15 of the team's 28 games. Throw in closer CJ Couch, who finished the season with seven saves, and this rotation is going to be tough to beat. If that isn't enough, Buford has four more senior pitchers waiting their turn in the spotlight.

Defensively, most of the team is back. All-state performer Reece McIntyre is back at first base, while Brandon Jolliff is back at third base. Meanwhile, Austin Turner and Christian Griffin return in the outfield. All-state standout Evan Place returns and will play a variety of positions. Turner and Place both batted better than, 400 last season.

The 2015 Buford squad that won the state title and the 2016 team that finished as the state runnerup were good. This Buford team could potentially be better.



LOGANVILLE

It would be easy to write off the two-time defending state champions after graduation took a bite out of their lineup. But the truth is, there is a lot of talent remaining. The younger players just need time to mature. The Red Devils will miss all-state pitchers Bay Witcher, Joseph Brandon and Seth Clark, but the state will get a good look this year at right-handed pitcher Connor Bruce who won't disappoint. Offensively, Loganville has a lot of players like Dylan Strickland, Jacob Boyd, lan King and Blaine Marchman who have played in big games and know the Loganville way.



This could potentially be Ola's best team in school history. A strong group of pitchers will keep the Mustangs in the postseason chase – Evan Boyle, Tyler Richardson, Patrick Holloman and Dalton Thomas. After making the guarterfinals of the state playoffs last spring, look for Ola to do even bigger things in 2019.



CARROLLTON

The Trojans won 29 games last year and went to the state quarterfinals. The biggest concern is the lack of pitching. If Carrolton can find enough quality arms, they could contend for a state championship. There probably isn't a better hitting team in the state than the Trojans. Five players in the lineup who return batted .382 or better last year.



LOCUST GROVE

The Wildcats would have started the season ranked higher had All-state pitcher Nolan Crisp not graduated early and enrolled at Florida for the spring. Even without Crisp, Locust Grove is still going to be among the state's best. Pitchers Joe Roden and Cole English return, but it may be the offense led by Luke Welborn, Josh Newton and Owen Marchant that will carry this team.



WAYNE COUNTY

After making the Class 5A state championship series in 2017, the Yellow Jackets somewhat took a step back last year when they lost in the second round of the state playoffs. Look for Wayne to be back this spring, especially behind pitchers Gant Starling and Brice Miller.



WHITEWATER

The Wildcats haven't fielded a team with this much talent since they finished as back-to-back state runner-ups in 2014 and 2015. Whitewater has enough arms and offense to go a long way. The biggest strength will be a lethal pitching rotation. The Wildcats appear to be back.



HARRIS COUNTY

This will be Harris County's best team since the Tigers went to the state quarterfinals in 2012 in Class 4A. The pitching depth is a concern, but the Tigers have enough weapons on offense to score plenty of runs until some pitching matures.



The Wildcats got a taste of the state playoffs last year and they want nothing more than a return. Villa Rica has an excellent group of returners who can put the ball in play and score plenty of runs. But like their region foe Carrollton, the Wildcats have some concerns with their pitching depth.



STARR'S MILL

The Panthers need to grow and mature after making back-to-back trips to the Class 5A state semifinals. It would seem obvious that Starr's Mill doesn't have the experience to make another deep run. However, don't count out a young group of players who got plenty of playing time last year.



VFTFRANS

Perhaps for the first time since the school opened in 2010-11, the Warhawks won't be favored to win their region. There are some gaping holes to fill, but Veterans will have some talented players to step up and fill those voids. The Warhawks will be young, but by the end of the season, Veterans should be in the postseason chase.



Injuries hurt coach Trey Henson in his first season at Riverwood last year. With the majority of the team back plus a lot of younger players who received playing time last year, look for Riverwood to have its best season since 2013. Avoiding injuries will be key, but the senior class is strong and pitcher Brett Thomas will carry the load on the mound.



CHAMBLEE

The Bulldogs took Region 7-5A champion Carrollton to a decisive third game last year in the second round of the state playoffs before falling. The bulk of that team returns, and Chamblee seeks to capitalize off that momentum.



SOUTH EFFINGHAM

The Mustangs have been relatively quiet since they made it to the Class 5A state semifinals in 2016. Longtime veteran coach Todd Eubanks becomes the third South Effingham coach in four years. The Mustangs won 16 games in 2018.



JONES COUNTY

There aren't many programs in the state who can boast of the kind of winning consistency Jones County can over the past decade. The Greyhounds don't have a lot of players who put up flashy numbers last year, but Jones County will be a tough team to beat in 2019. The senior class is strong.

Jefferson claws way to first state baseball title

It was the perfect ending for a season that could have been scripted perfectly by Hollywood. But there was no way film-makers would have scripted Jefferson High School's 2018 state baseball championship season any better than it actually happened.

"It was perfect for a Hollywood movie," infielder/pitcher Lane Watkins said. "Nobody expected us to do anything like that."

Which is why the Dragons' Class 4A title, the first Georgia High School Association state baseball title in school history, will be remembered in Jefferson for a long time.

Consider these facts:

Not many expected them to make the playoffs from the rugged Region 8. Stephens County, Madison County and North Oconee had more returning talent and experience.

Jefferson didn't have a single injury all season. They had one player miss a practice with a bruised heel. No injury kept a player from missing any games.

The Dragons needed a walk-off hit to beat Chestatee in Game 3 of the first round of the playoffs. They also needed a walk-off to beat Woodward Academy in the first game of the quarterfinal series.

Jefferson stunned the nation when they swept nationally-ranked Blessed Trinity in the semifinals, then beat tradition-rich Cartersville in three games in the state championship series.

"The Lord blessed us over the season, no doubt," coach Tommy Knight said. "But with this group of kids, it didn't matter what anybody said. They played for each other."

The Dragons (28-12) returned nine starters, but the preseason attention focused on Stephens County and Madison County, who both made deep postseason runs in 2017. In addition, North Oconee had one of the nation's top players in Kumar Rocker and a lineup that could score plenty of runs. It was somewhat of a surprise when the Dragons won the region crown and played host to upstart Chestatee in the first round.

The two teams split a doubleheader to force a Game 3. That set the stage for Kade McNally, the No. 9 hitter in the lineup, whose walk-off homer in the bottom of the seventh sent the Dragons to a 6-4 victory to take the best-of-three series.

Jefferson swept Northwest Whitfield in the second round before needing another walkoff hit to beat Woodward Academy in Game 1 of the quarterfinal series. The Dragons scored three runs in the bottom of the seventh, highlighted by freshman Mason

Cooper's RBI single that scored Billy Finch for the winning run in a 5-4 victory. Jefferson lost Game 2, then took the series with a 10-5 victory in Game 3, setting up a mammoth series at Blessed Trinity.

Knight had a message for his players the next day at practice after eliminating Woodward Academy.

"Coach came out and said, "Why not us," said senior pitcher Patrick Hickox. "He asked why we couldn't be one of the teams to beat them."

The Dragons won the first game 10-7, then Watkins hurled a five-hit shutout in a 2-0 victory in Game 2 to sweep the series.

The momentum carried over into the state championship series where Jefferson topped Cartersville in three games for the state title. Knight said it was because of a group of players who weren't intimidated, didn't care about personal stats and played for each other. The phrase "Why not us" became the team's motto and ended up on Jefferson's state championship rings.

Knight told a story about Hickox, who earned the Game 1 win and the save in Game 3 in the state championship series. He said when one of his teammates made an error, Hickox took time off the mound and went and had a conversation with the player.

"Patrick was the leader," Watkins said. "I made an error at third base and he came over to me, put his arm around me and told me he had this and to just shake it off. We all started doing that for each other."





Building on the foundation

Lovett wins second title in three years, fifth since 2005

Since Lance Oubs took over the Lovett School baseball program in 2005, he annually challenges his senior class to continue the program's tradition.

And his strategy has worked, for the most part, to perfection.

In 14 seasons, Oubs has guided Lovett to five state titles (2006, '09, '13, '16 and '18). The Lions won their second title in three seasons in 2018, topping region rival Westminster to win the Georgia High School Association Class 3A championship. It was the program's ninth championship overall.

"I don't want to say I was surprised," Oubs said of winning the title. "But it came down to the team's resiliency and their mentality. A large part of their success was put in place by the senior class who won the state title in 2016."

That squad, Oubs said, helped prepare the 2018 edition. It's part of a culture Oubs and his staff has tried to build. Since 2005, no team competing in the GHSA has won more titles than Lovett.

And the Lion coaching staff hopes this year's senior class established a foundation for future Lovett squads.

"A large part of (our success) comes down to the culture of the program," Oubs said. "One thing we try to stress to seniors is that it's their job to perpetuate the tradition of the Lovett baseball program."

It wasn't easy for the Lions in 2018 though. Lovett finished second in a brutal Region 5-3A and had to top powerful Calhoun in the first round. They then drew defending state champion North Hall in the second round and needed three games to top the Trojans, including an extra-inning victory in the final game to clinch the series.

Standout pitcher Ben O'Meara earned the victory in Game 1, then he had 28 pitches he could throw in a decisive Game 3. He ended up throwing three innings in the nine-inning victory, never exceeding his pitch count.


The Lions needed three games to eliminate Southeast Bulloch in the quarterfinals before sweeping past Morgan County in the semifinals to earn a rematch in the finals with rival Westminster, who won the Region 5 title. The two teams split their games during the regular season.

After Westminster won the first game of the state championship series, Lovett rallied back to take the second game on Charles Gibson's sacrifice fly for a 7-6 victory.

After rain forced the final game of the series to Rome's State Mutual Stadium, Dhruv Patel helped pitch Lovett to a 2-0 victory in the finale to capture the championship.

While Lovett defeated most of its opponents by playing small-ball on offense, Oubs said a deep pitching rotation was the team's strength. While O'Meara was the leader, they got quality performances from Patel, Lance Beck, Grayson Nix, Wyatt Nelson, Charles Gibson and left-hander David Underwood throughout the season.

"I'm super proud and happy for my guys," Oubs told the Marietta Daily Journal. "It was a goal of our senior class to get back to the state championship. They experienced what it was like as sophomores two years ago and knew what it took to return. They led the younger guys, and I couldn't be more happy for them and the rest of the team. It was a great moment."

Forgetting the past

Benedictine coach motivates Cadets to win second title in five years

Before the start of the 2018 season, Benedictine baseball coach Kevin Farmer took down the state championship banners from 1961 and 2014 off the outfield fence at Brian Parker Field.

His reason?

"I told the players that we were not going to talk about the past, and we were not going to make the kids live up to the expectations of past teams," he said. "I told them we were going to go out, play and have fun."

The Cadets did just that, rolling to their second state baseball title in five seasons. Benedictine captured the Georgia High School Association Class 2A title with a 31-7 record, using strong pitching, timely hitting and solid defense.

But Farmer's idea of taking down the banners before the season certainly got the team's attention.

"It was kind of shocking and we were like, 'What is he doing,'" Ryan Pickard said. "It let us know that he cared about our team. We weren't going to be looking in the past."

The Cadets returned a solid senior class, but a brutal early-season schedule that featured larger schools like Richmond Hill, North Oconee, Madison County, Brunswick and East Paulding had Benedictine starting the season with a 3-4 mark.

It wasn't until freshman Carter Holton hurled a perfect game on the mound in a 10-0 victory over Statesboro on Feb. 26 that things began to click.

"Sweeping Statesboro helped bring a little brotherhood to the team", Farmer said.

After sweeping a pair of games with Statesboro to improve to 5-4, they won 10 straight before hitting a small patch of adversity. After a one-run victory over Colleton (S.C.) County, the Cadets dropped their only two region games of the season when they were swept by Bacon County.

It was a wakeup call.

"After we got swept by Bacon, we came back and beat Vidalia and Jeff Davis, the two best teams in the region," Holton said. "I thought that maybe we had a chance."

After losing to Bacon County, Benedictine closed the regular season with six straight wins and captured the Region 2-2A title.

"We told ourselves that we were not losing another game, and we were not losing a series like we did against Bacon County again," Pickard said. "So we gave it all we had the rest of the year."

After needing a late rally to beat Early County in Game 1 of the first round of the state playoffs, the Cadets swept the Bobcats, Screven County and Social Circle before needing three games to oust Callaway in the semifinals.


After dropping the first game 13-5 at Callaway, Benedictine rallied for a pair of shutout victories to advance.

Then they continued their stellar play in the postseason by sweeping Berrien in the championship series at Savannah's Grayson Stadium.

Garrison Gunby, Holton and Walker Barlow led a stingy pitching rotation, while Holton and Johnny Richardson led a dangerous lineup that produced strong offensive numbers.

"Going back to taking down the banners, that showed us that Coach Farmer had faith in us to go out and perform," Pickard said. "We thought to ourselves, 'What can we do to leave our mark?'"

Winning the school's third baseball championship left a mark that won't be erased.





The Blue Devils are dropping to Class 2A after having success in Class 3A the past two years. And this should be Bremen's best team since the school won a Class 1A state title in 1990.

Ding-ding

Gordon Lee provides knockout punch in Class 1A Public, wins title

It was late in the regular season and Mike Dunfee had a message for his Gordon Lee baseball team.

"I asked the guys on the team a question," he said. "I said in a boxing match when you have two guys in a corner and they come out, what happens next? One kid said something stupid, then another kid said 'ding-ding.'

"I told them the regular season was over and 'ding-ding,' now the fun was beginning."

The "ding-ding" Dunfee referred to was the sound the bell makes, signaling the beginning and ending of a boxing match.

Little did Dunfee know his facetious question became a rallying point for the Trojans. After finishing as the state runner-up in 2017, Gordon Lee swept all four of its opponents in the postseason and rolled to the Georgia High School Association Class 1A Public state championship. The Trojans, who had three state runner-up finishes in a five-year span, were determined to win their first title since 1984.

"We knew we did not want to come back with another state runner-up trophy," said catcher Dylan Minghini, who was named the Georgia Dugout Preview Magazine Class 1A Public Player of the Year as a senior.

Gordon Lee (28-8) was tested by an early season nonregion schedule that consisted of Vidalia, West Laurens, Ringgold, Heritage-Catoosa, Northwest Whitfield and Rockmart, as well as a brutal Region 6-1A schedule. And during the year, the Trojans learned a lot about themselves.

They returned a strong pitching rotation of Austin Thompson, Caleb Hopkins and Mason Pettigrew, who were joined by underclassmen Jake Poindexter, Jake Wright, Logan Streetman, Will Sizemore and Hunter Hodson. The rotation hurled five shutouts in eight postseason games and lived up to expectations.

But the strength of the team may have been the offense, which outscored Clinch County, Charlton County, Bowdon and Telfair County by a combined 63-5 in the postseason. Minghini, Thompson, JD Day, Hodson and Sizemore provided most of the firepower.

"One day coach went on this offensive tirade mainly aimed at me," Hopkins said. "He said we were not a home run team, and we would need to depend on our defense and pitching, and we were more of a scrap team. He said we'd just have to play defense and gut it out. I think that was something everybody needed to hear. The next day against Darlington, we hit three home runs in the game."

Dunfee tried all sorts of motivational tactics, but one thing he tried to steer away from was talking about the 2017 squad that came up short. That was where "ding-ding" was born.

"Every team is different," Dunfee said. "The kids didn't want to hear about last year. Half of them were not here. But they ran with that 'dingding.' There was one time in the pregame, I didn't even say anything. I just walked up to them and said, 'ding-ding.' They took it from there."

Hopkins said the team ran with it and used the term as motivation.

"We peaked at the right time," Minghini said. "We gelled and it helped us perform better. It had been 30-plus years since the school won a state baseball championship. So we felt like it was our duty to bring back home a state championship trophy."

After Dunfee said what seemed like an endless drive to Savannah's Grayson Stadium to meet Telfair County for the state championship series, Gordon Lee hoisted the championship trophy after providing the knockout punch.

And "ding-ding," the state championship trophy made its way to Chickamauga.





GORDON LEE

Not since Charlton County won back-to-back state championships in 2013-14 has a Georgia High School Association Class 1A Public School team won consecutive state titles. Gordon Lee has a good chance of doing that this spring after the Trojans rolled to their first state championship since 1984. After three times of finishing as the state runner-up in six seasons, Gordon Lee was nearly invincible when postseason play began in 2018.

New coach Brian Vance inherits a team good enough to contend for a state title. But the Red Devils will have to topple mighty Gordon Lee, who also competes in the same region, to do it. Bowdon has two of the best arms in the state in Trent Estes and Luke Rainwater, And Cv Horton and Braden Bowen lead what could be an explosive offense.

The Indians have enough returning pitching to cause headaches for the opposition in Class 1A. Sophomore Brodie Chestnutt, a Florida State commit, Will Hudson and Zach Smith form a three-headed pitching rotation that is going to be hard to beat. The offense has the ability to score plenty of runs.

In a rebuilding season last year, the Wildcats still won the Region 4-1A title, won 24 games and made the state quarterfinals. It's a proven fact that Schley County reloads. The Wildcats have just about everyone back this season, including a strong pitching rotation that will consist of Lorne Barineau, Ashton Goodin, Dylan Windham, Trent Bivins and Garrett Peavy.



JOHNSON COUNTY

Coach Chuck Beale has quietly built Johnson County into a solid program that is tough to beat. The Trojans lost a good bit of talent to graduation, but the majority of the team's major contributors are back. Third baseman Dra Darrisaw and catcher Brett Caneega return to spark the offense, while dominant two-year starting pitcher Adam Hooks won 11 games last year.



Don't ever discount ECI, who always seems to find a way into the postseason picture. The Bulldogs have good talent returning as well as a shutdown pitcher in Tyler Flakes. The senior right-hander will help take the Bulldogs as far as they want to go.



TELFAIR COUNTY

Replacing all-everything players Ryan Dopson and Ian Blankenship will be tough, but the Trojans have enough playmakers on offense to contend again. Graduation and player transfers took a bite out of Commerce's lineup. But the Tigers have been very consistent under coach Steve Cotrell, and they will continue their winning ways this spring.

Something to prove

After sour ending in 2017, Tattnall rolls to another title

Since joining the Georgia High School Association five years ago, Tattnall Square's baseball program has been a dominant force in the Class 1A private classification.

So when the Trojans were swept in the state championship series by Savannah Christian at the end of the 2017 season, Tattnall Square felt like it had something to prove in 2018.

The Trojans did just that last spring, rolling to a 34-4 finish and capturing the school's 10th state baseball title. In four years as a GHSA member, the baseball program has finished as a state semifinalist, state runner-up and captured two titles (2016 and 2018). But after a sour ending in 2017, Tattnall made its mission in 2018 to return to the top.

"We had something to prove," said utility player Miles Morris. "If we went out with nothing to prove, then we wouldn't come out with the same intensity."

Tattnall opened the season with three wins, including two over Class 5A schools Ola and Hampton. But the Trojans went 1-2 in a tournament at Athens Christian that included eventual Class 4A champion Jefferson, Oconee County and Aquinas. They lost to Jefferson and Aquinas, two games Tattnall coach Joey Hiller believed they could have won.

It was a wake-up call.

"We weren't used to losing much," said pitcher Luke Laskey, who was named the Georgia Dugout Preview Magazine's Class 1A Private Player of the Year as a senior last year.

"After that, we set the tone."

After that trip during the second week of the regular season, Tattnall defeated powerful Holy Innocents and Class 3A Redan, as well as run-ruling defending Class 1A state champion Savannah Christian. They also earned a pair of wins over Class 5A Locust Grove and lost just once, a 3-1 setback to region rival Stratford.

While the team played well, it wasn't until a spring break trip to Saint Simons Island where the team took things up a notch. The Trojans defeated Class 7A Camden County as well as Darlington and host Frederica.

"I think that's when things started to click," Hiller said. "The seniors started to bond more with the younger guys."

Tattnall split a doubleheader with Strong Rock Christian just before the Region 7-1A Tournament, prompting a stern speech from Hiller, who reminded his team that they could have easily won every game they lost.

"From that point on, we felt like they needed a constant reminder - what are we proving today?" Hiller said.

The Trojans didn't lose again. When they hit the postseason, they rolled past Brookstone, Wesleyan and First Presbyterian Day by a combined 61-13. Then they swept Prince Avenue Christian for the state championship.

Laskey and Brooks Gorman were the main cogs on a lethal pitching staff, while BJ Spears, Austin Marchman, Trey Ham, Logan Fink, Laskey, Dawson Brown and All-American Kendall Logan Simmons provided the offensive spark.

"The main thing for us as seniors was we wanted to leave a legacy," Laskey said. "But we also had something to prove."

And they proved it by hoisting another state championship trophy.

TATTNALL SQUARE

Since coming over from the Georgia Independent Schools Association, Tattnall Square has dominated the Class 1A Private division. The Trojans have two state titles, a state runner-up finish and a trip to the state semifinals in four seasons, and they have combined for a 117-20 record. The Trojans will dominate again this season behind a wealth of returning talent and could make it four straight trips to the state championship series.

The pitching rotation will be just as lethal as last year. The Trojans will miss ace Luke Laskey, but last year's No. 2 starter Brooks Gorman dominated as a sophomore. The right-hander was virtually unhittable and will pick up from where he left off. Junior right-hander Dawson Brown will likely move into the No. 2 role after showing a load of promise as a sophomore last year.

Offensively, catcher Trey Ham returns as well as outfielder Beau Spears. And versatile Miles Morris also is back.



SAVANNAH CHRISTIAN

As long as the Raiders have two of the classification's top players in Jarrett Brown and Kyle Hilton, Savannah Christian will be expected to go deep. The duo are lethal on the mound, and they can spark the offense. The pair have an excellent supporting cast including Cameron Crosby and Garrett Bradley.



HOLY INNOCENTS'

The Bears have been as good as advertised the past three seasons, but they are still searching for their first state championship since 2007. Holy Innocents' returns one of the classification's top pitchers in three-year starter Guillermo Granier, who will keep the Bears in the hunt. Offensively, Holy Innocents' returns two offensive leaders in Harrison Padgett and Caleb Ketchup.



WFSI FYAN

This could potentially be the best Wesleyan team since the Wolves last won a state championship as a member of Class 2A in 2015. After a disappointing season in 2017, the Wolves returned last year and made it to the state quarterfinals. Wesleyan has the offense and the pitching.



In two seasons, coach Shawn Oliver has helped build Fellowship Christian into a playoff contender. The Paladins reached the second round last year and will build off that run. Fellowship Christian should compete for the rugged Region 6-1A title with a wealth of talent that includes Cameron Gill, junior Preston Joye and three-year starter Isaac Bouton.



PROVIDENCE

The Storm peaked at the right time last year and made the quarterfinals of the playoffs. Providence Christian will continue to build off that positive momentum. They have a three-headed pitching rotation of Cole Tillotson, Simon Graf and Ben Johnson that is as good as anybody.



KINGS RIDGE **CHRISTIAN**

The Tigers have been one of the Class 1A Private division's more-consistent programs since 2014. Look for Kings Ridge Christian to be in the hunt again. The Tigers have a solid corps of returning pitchers who will keep the team in games until their offense matures.



FIRST PRESBYTERIAN

After a run to the state semifinals last year, the Vikings have a young but talented team that is anxious for a return. First Presbyterian lost the bulk of its pitching rotation to graduation, but don't sleep on this program.



GFORGE WAITON

After winning 17 games last year, the Bulldogs return the bulk of their talent and should make a solid run. The team is loaded with seniors, including one of the classification's top athletes in Omar Daniels and pitcher Noah Coleman.



HEBRON CHRISTIAN

The Lions started late last season, rebounded and won the rugged Region 8-1A title. With as many as 15 players returning from that team, look for Hebron Christian to be in the hunt once again. The team will be talented, but they will need some time to mature.



SAVANNAH COUNTRY DAY

This will be the best Savannah Country Day team in coach Dan Garofano's tenure. The Hornets have the pitching, defense and the offense to contend. They made the state playoffs last season before losing in three games in the first round. SCD should be back with a roster loaded with seniors.



12 🆚 TRINITY CHRISTIAN

Since Tattnall Square left the GISA after the 2014 season, Trinity Christian has dominated the GISA and won a state title last year in the organization's highest classification. It remains to be seen how the Lions will fare in their first season in the GHSA. Trinity definitely has the talent to succeed.



PINECREST ACADEMY

The Paladins have established themselves as a contender after making the postseason last year, then coming within a game of making the state semifinals. Pinecrest Academy returns its top two pitchers who will lead the team in right-handers Patrick O'Rourke and Caleb Bohn.
